

The Squamish Environment Society (SES) was formed in 1982 as a direct response to a proposal to develop a coal terminal on the Squamish estuary. Our original name was Squamish Estuary Conservation Society.

SES has played a strong advocacy role respecting environmental quality, wetlands preservation, and sustainable forestry and fisheries, to *preserve natural ecosystems*.

We are a community leader in environmental education. Our Eagle Watch, Squamish Estuary Explorations, Citizen Scientist, and Young Earth Keepers programs; and other activities and events; encourage people to *explore and enjoy nature* and engage the community to *create and share knowledge*.

We focus our efforts in the upper Howe Sound area and the watersheds that feed it.

SES is a member of BC Nature, an affiliation of about 40 natural history clubs province-wide. As a BC Nature member, our members receive the BC Nature magazine, published quarterly.
